#### DISCIPLE-MAKING MINISTRY **HIGHLIGHTS**

With multiple campuses and multiple ministries at each campus, there is no shortage of disciple-making efforts that inspire us! Here are three that really stand out across our entire church.

#### RISE UP

In October 2019, we launched a church-wide initiative called Rise Up to fund construction of a new building for Compass South Naperville and to further support some key ministry partnerships Here, Near & Far. We synchronized our worship services, small groups, and



student and children's ministries to focus on transformative themes of generosity, unity and legacy. By God's grace, \$9.8 million has been committed so far to our \$10 million goal and \$4.2 million of that has been given to date. We have truly come together as a church for this God-honoring cause!

#### ONLINE MINISTRY

Also in October 2019, we started livestreaming our worship services online. By God's providence, this was a huge benefit to our church when we had to immediately cease our in-person worship services in March due to the Coronavirus pandemic. We were able to continue our online worship services and connect with our whole church family through the internet. Since then, we have made the bold move to expand Compass Online, hiring a Campus Pastor to guide us for the years to come in significant ongoing church community and faith engagement online!

#### CONSTRUCTION

In June 2020, we started construction on the new permanent home for Compass South Naperville. We started this campus 10 years ago. This part of our church family has grown significantly but has always met in rented or leased space. In 2019, God graciously supplied 8 acres for us on the corner of Rt 59 and 103rd St in Naperville. We expect to open this new building in summer 2021. In the next year alone, we expect to meet hundreds of new people through this new site. The building is 40,000 sq ft dedicated to helping people find and grow in faith!

#### INTRODUCTION

Our budget is designed to support our overall discipleship and evangelism mission, "To Love Him More, So More Love Him". We hope this report will help you discern our stewardship of the resources entrusted to us for that calling. We believe that The Compass Church is collectively and eternally responsible for each season of ministry life together. Our church family gives generously and sacrificially, believing in our mission and ministries.

#### **BUDGET NOTES**

At the time of this printing, we were 10 months into our fiscal year. The projected numbers for FY20 are where we expect to be at the end of the year.



#### OUR FISCAL YEAR

Our ministry cycle follows the same rhythm as our **Fiscal Year**, from September 1 to August 31. Our 2021 Fiscal Year starts September 1, 2020. The budget chart in this report shows the proposed use of our church budget in this next fiscal year. Our Elders and Staff work together to shape the proposed budget, and then ask our Members to vote on the budget at our Annual Vision Gathering. This year's gathering is Sunday, August 30.

#### **OUR THREE CHURCH FUNDS**

The Compass Church has three designated funds that contributors can give toward: the **Ministry Fund**, the **Expansion Fund**, and the **Assistance Fund**. The budget proposal in this report, which will be voted on, is for our Ministry Fund. Our Expansion Fund is for new initiatives that advance the Mission and Vision of our church; for example, our funding of the new construction we are building in South Naperville. Our Assistance Fund is specifically for meeting needs of people in our church family who have requested care during a difficult financial season and for supporting some of our local Community Impact partners.

#### MINISTRY FUND NOTES

Our Ministry Fund budget has four main categories: **Staff, Spaces, Strategies,** and **Savings**. The Ministry Fund is our main source of funding for the many ministries we have. Since March 2020, we have made \$500K of spending plan adjustments to our Ministry Fund in order to control spending during the Coronavirus pandemic. Our Savings is for long-term cash reserves that protect our church as we bring ongoing and lasting change to the communities we love and serve. We currently have the equivalent of about 50 days of operating capital in long-term cash reserves. By God's grace, we have not used our Savings, so far, during this 2020 pandemic season.

#### MINISTRY FUND GIVING

Through June 2020, 10 months into FY20, our Ministry Fund giving has been \$7 million. Our Compass Bolingbrook leases have brought in another \$87K in FY20, which puts us on pace for about \$8.5 million given toward our \$9 million FY20 budget. Thank you for being a vital part of our movement in this way!

#### MINISTRY FUND INCOME

In FY21, our Ministry Fund will have three income sources to achieve our \$9.2 million budget: \$8.9 million generously and sacrificially given by the households of our church family (this number is the same as FY20), \$100K in Compass Bolingbrook lease income and \$200K of an internal transfer from the sale of a church owned home, which was sold for \$325K a few years ago.

#### HERE, NEAR & FAR FUNDING

Our Community Impact (Here), CompassNational (Near) and our CompassGlobal (Far) budgets are part of our Ministry Fund, under the Strategies section.

Will, Kane and Kendall counties. Each of our campuses guide our efforts for the local areas they are in. Some of our Community Impact partnerships are funded through our Assistance Fund - in FY21, this will be about \$30K of additional support. We have \$120K of additional Community Impact funding happening through our Rise Up campaign in FY20 & FY21.

compass NATIONAL is our domestic ministry to serve other churches around the country, steward our relationship with our denomination and partner with national collegiate ministries. We have \$120K of additional CompassNational funding happening through our Rise Up campaign in FY20 & FY21.

COMPASSGLOBAL is our international ministry to serve or start other churches around the world, support missionaries, and contribute to gospel-centric humanitarian work. We have \$250K of additional CompassGlobal funding happening through our Rise Up campaign in FY20 & FY21.

#### **EXPANSION FUND**

In the past 18 months (January 2019 through June 2020), \$4.2 million has been given to our Expansion Fund for our Rise Up campaign. Our goal is to raise \$10 million; \$500K for partnerships Here, Near & Far and \$9.5 million toward our \$11.5 million construction project.

#### ASSISTANCE FUND

Our Assistance Fund continues to be a wonderful expression of our church family and God's care. So far in FY20, \$366K has been given to this fund and we have distributed \$230K of support. In the past 6 months, we have also distributed \$66K from this fund toward special Coronavirus-related circumstances. In FY19, \$277K was entrusted to this fund, and we distributed \$228K.

#### CHURCH DEBT

As of August 2020, we owe \$6.6 million in mortgage debt on our Naperville property. About half of this mortgage debt is related to our land purchase in South Naperville. Our church has a long history of aggressively paying down debt to better serve our mission.

### CHURCH LEADERSHIP

Dear Compass Church Family,

I look back over this last year with praise in my heart for The Compass Church. To know that we have a Savior who loves us with a love that can't be measured stretches my mind and grows my relationship with Him. As I listen to my granddaughter squeal with delight, she reminds me of the praise that should be coming from my lips to the Lord's ears.

We have seen the hand of God at work in our Rise Up campaign which has allowed us to start the building of a permanent home for our South Naperville Campus! We praise Him for the level of involvement that we have seen across our church body through a focus of generosity, unity and legacy. We could not have come this far without our Heavenly Father's enablement. We praise Him as we marvel at how this project progresses.

In Acts 16 we can read the story of Paul and Silas being severely flogged and put into prison. As hopeless as their condition seemed, with nothing that they could do, we can see their response – they lifted their voices in praise. As we went into our "stay at home" mode at the end of March due to COVID-19, we can praise God that The Compass Church was prepared to change gears almost immediately. I confess that lifting my voice up in praise was not my immediate reaction. But looking back I can see that praise caused me to remember the role that God had in the moment. Lifting my voice in praise was an expression of faith.

As we move into the future, we can count on the fact that God is sovereign, that God is good, and that God will continue to lead and walk with us.

ABOUT OUR ELDERS



As of August 2020, we have 1,406 official Members of The Compass Church.
