Paul's Third Journey

Acts 18–21

STORY POINT: PAUL USED EVERY OPPORTUNITY TO TELL PEOPLE ABOUT JESUS.

Paul traveled to Corinth. He met Aquila and his wife, Priscilla. On the Sabbath days, Paul went to the synagogue to persuade the Jews and Greeks to believe in Jesus. Some people believed, and the church grew in Corinth.

Paul traveled to Ephesus with his friends Aquila and Priscilla. Aquila and Priscilla stayed there while Paul visited churches in Asia. Paul helped the believers in the cities grow stronger in their faith.

Apollos came to Ephesus. Priscilla and Aquila took him to their home and explained more to him. Apollos traveled and taught others, using the Scriptures to show that Jesus is the Messiah.

Paul talked with a group of people until midnight. A young man named Eutychus was sitting in the window. He became very sleepy and fell out the window! Paul went to his side and put his arms around him, and Eutychus came back to life. The believers took Eutychus home and were comforted.

Paul traveled back toward Ephesus. He asked the leaders of the church to meet him in a nearby city. Paul said, "I am going to Jerusalem. I know that trouble and jail wait for me. I do not care about my own life. The most important thing is that I finish the work Jesus gave me to do." Paul and the church leaders prayed together. Then they went with him to the ship to say goodbye.

Christ Connection: As Paul traveled on his third missionary journey, he used every opportunity to tell people the good news about Jesus and to help the church. Paul was dedicated to Jesus, who called him to do the work of sharing the gospel.
