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Tissue Challenge

Supplies: facial tissue (1 per person)

Say: Today we heard a Bible story about a man named Abram who had a ton of faith. Does anyone remember what "faith" means? That's right. "Faith is being sure of what we hope for. It is being sure of what we do not see." Hebrews 11:1 (NIrV) God promised Abram a baby even though he was 100 years old. And not only did he promise him a baby, but that he would be the father of many. Even though Abram couldn't see how God could possibly bless the world through a regular old guy like him, he had faith that God could do it. Sometimes it is really hard to believe in something we can't see. Let's play a game to see how something we can't see can move something else.

Directions: Give everyone a facial tissue. We are going to play different rounds to see who can complete the challenge and stay in the round the longest. When someone fails the challenge, have them answer one of the questions. Continue playing different rounds and allowing different kids to answer the question.

Tissue Challenge:

- Hold one hand above your head and catch the tissue with the other below your waist.
- Hold one hand above you head and catch the tissue with your other hand below your knees.
- Hold your hand up high and catch the tissue on your foot.
- Hold your hand up high and catch the tissue between your legs.
- Throw the tissue up, spin around and catch it.
- Throw the tissue up and catch it on your head.

Question: Tell us about a time when you had to have faith? Was it easy or difficult? Why?

Question: A friend asked you to explain "faith" to them. What would you say?

Say: What do you think was moving the tissue around? How do you know the air is real if you can't see it? Just like the tissue moved in the unseen air, God also moves in our lives. He listens to your prayers, provides for you and protects you. Remember, when you are in a tough situation, to take a minute and remember that God is there with you even though you can't see Him.
